With the flood recovery still underway, as it will be for some time yet, I joined Minister for Emergency and Flood Recovery Steph Cooke and local candidate Tony Mileto on a visit to Eugowra. We chatted with a number of people about their recovery process including inspecting one of the more than 100 caravans provided as part of the At Home Caravans Program. This program allows residents whose homes were destroyed or badly damaged by floodwaters to live on their

own properties instead of being accommodated in motels in surrounding towns.

Minister Cooke also announced a funding grant to support the reprinting of a cookbook, originally produced by the Eugowra Promotion & Progress Association as a fundraiser for the community. With the original copies lost in the floods, this money will allow for another print run, a huge boost for this community.
